Who is eligible for WIC?

- Pregnant women
- Breastfeeding mothers of infants up to 12 months old
- Mothers of infants up to 6 months old
- Infants and children up to 5 years old (Must live in New Jersey, and meet income quidelines)

What are the WIC benefits?

- Access to healthy food
- Nutrition education
- Breastfeeding guidance
- Referrals to community support

What's in the monthly food package?
