The statewide ***Substance Use Overview*** provides statistics on substance use disorder treatment in New Jersey for calendar year 2022. In 2022, there were 85,266 treatment admissions and 84,437 discharges reported to the New Jersey Department of Human Services, Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services by substance use disorder treatment providers. These data were submitted through the web-based New Jersey Substance Abuse Monitoring System (NJSAMS). This report is based on the information provided in the April 2023 NJSAMS download data.

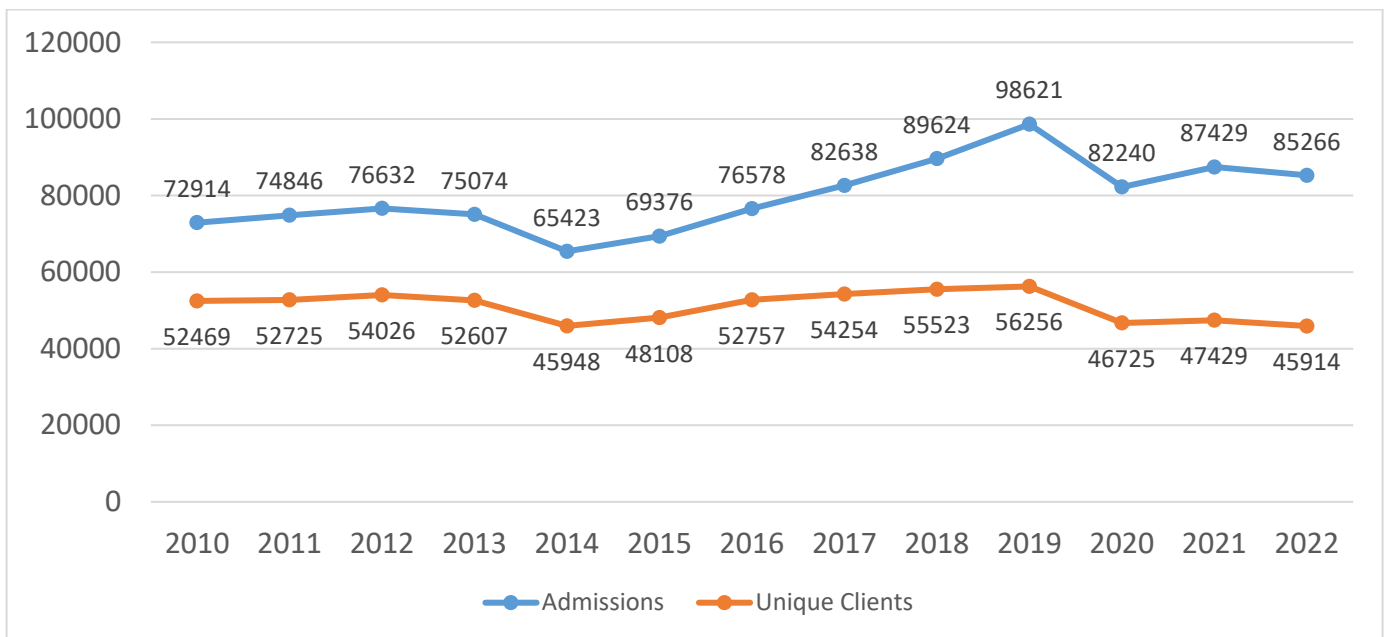

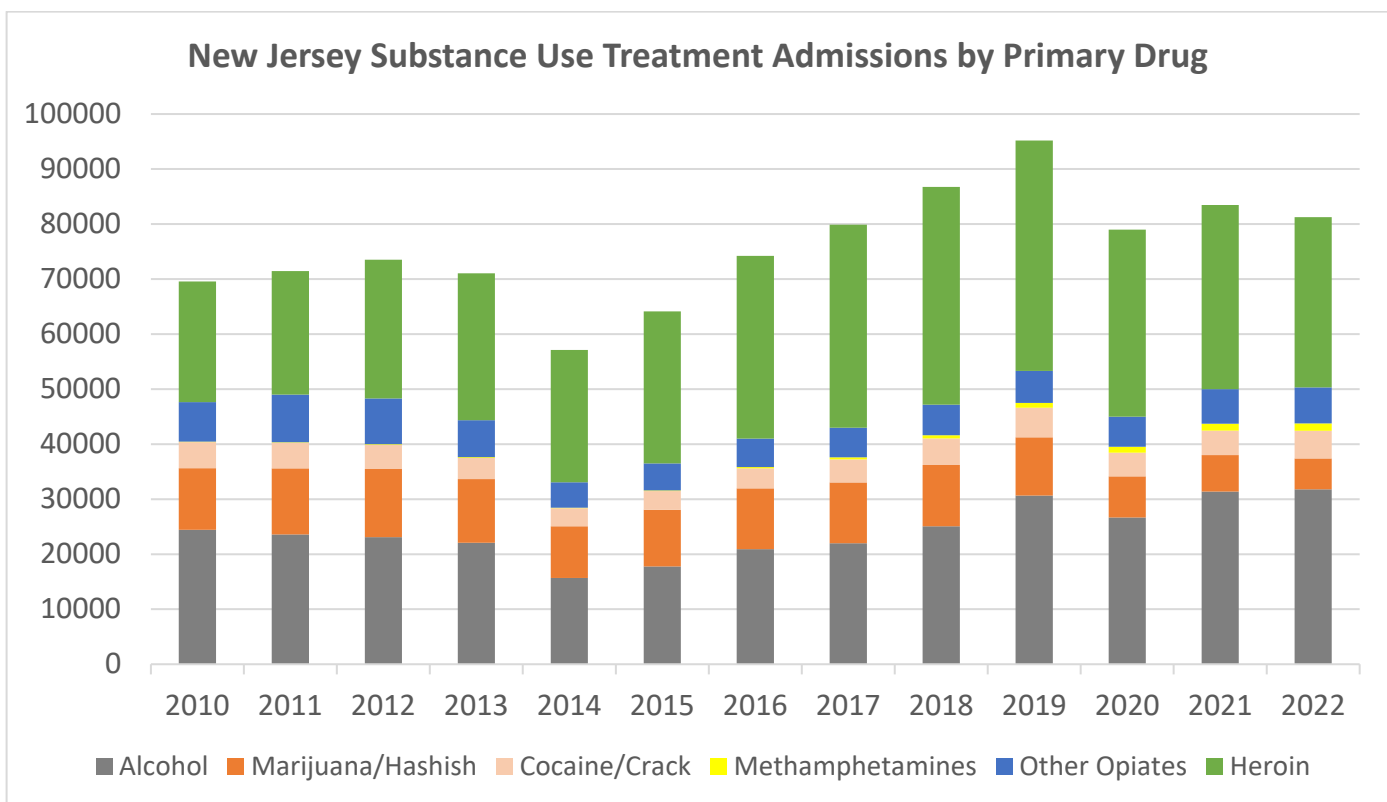

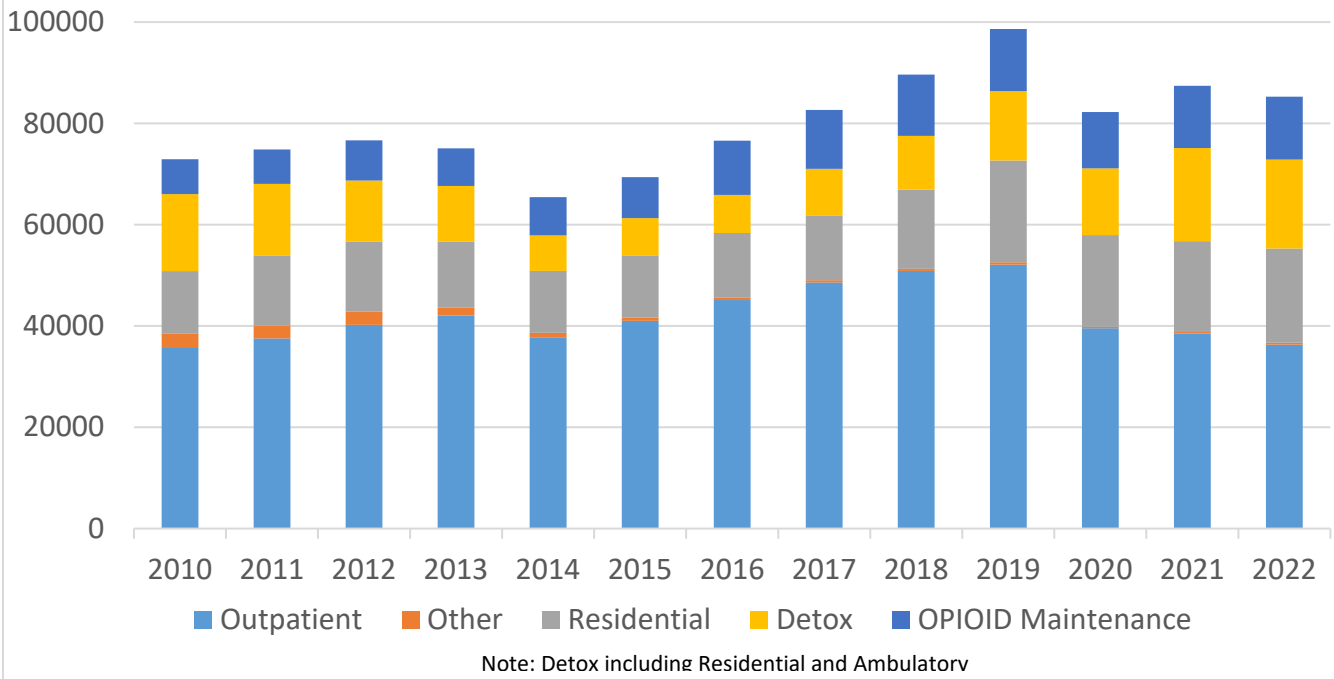
New Jersey Substance Use Treatment Admissions Trend 2010-2022



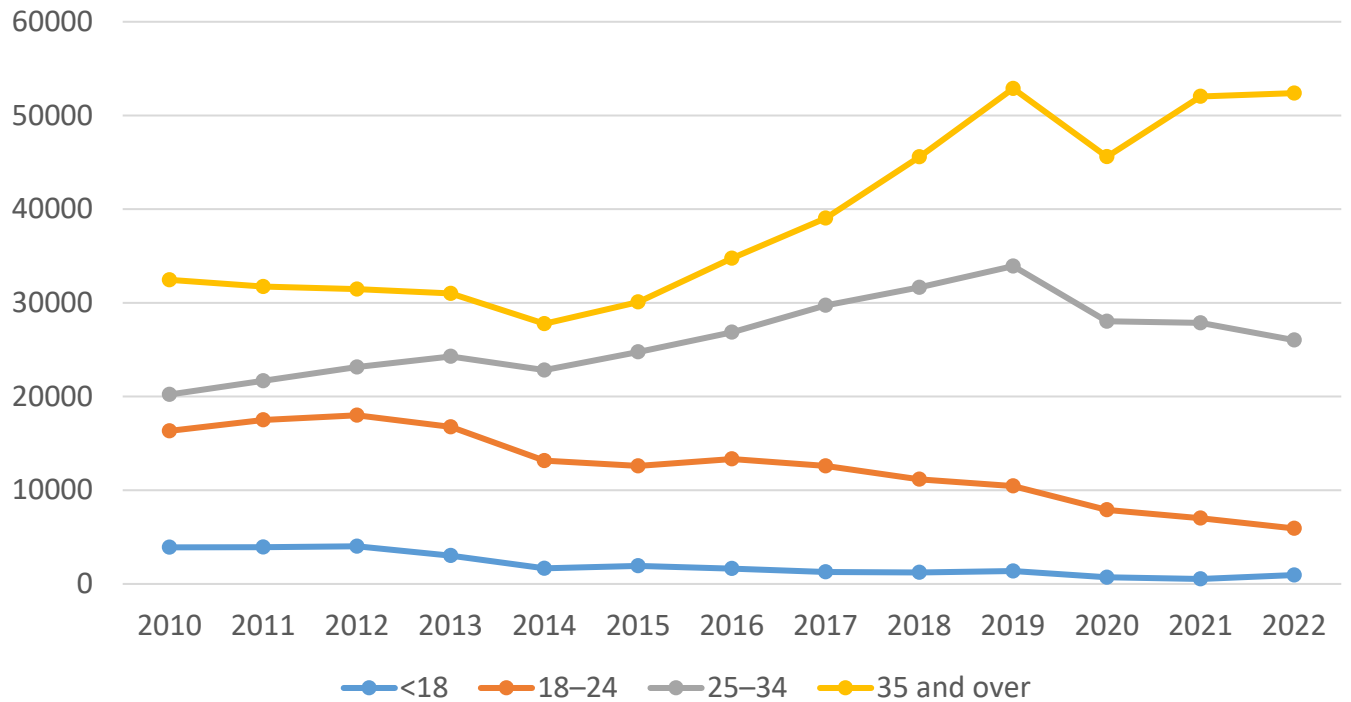
New Jersey Substance Use Treatment Admissions by Primary Drug

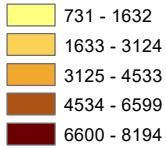

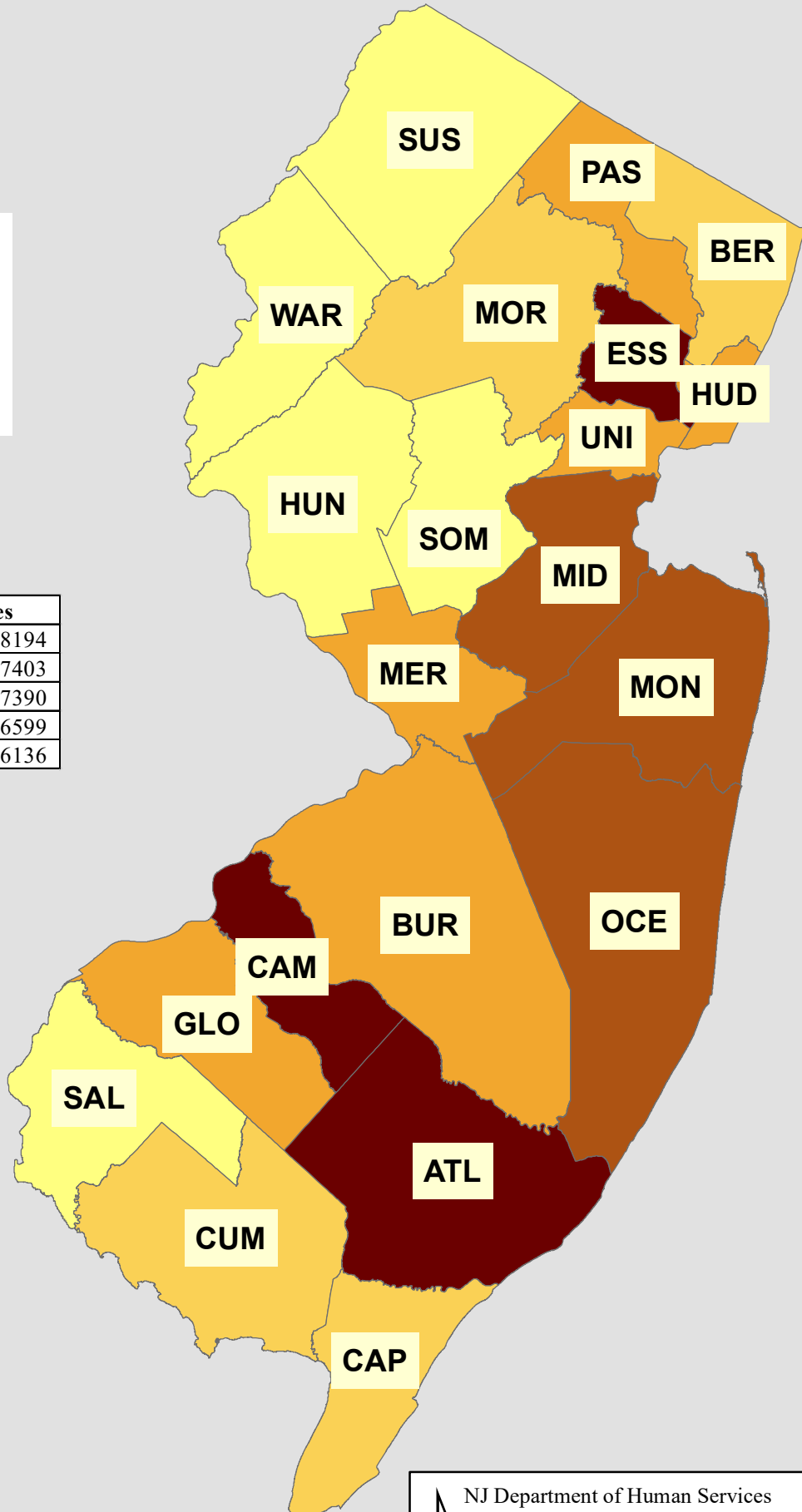
2022 NJ Substance Use Admissions by County of Residence

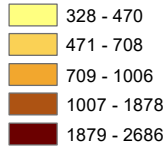

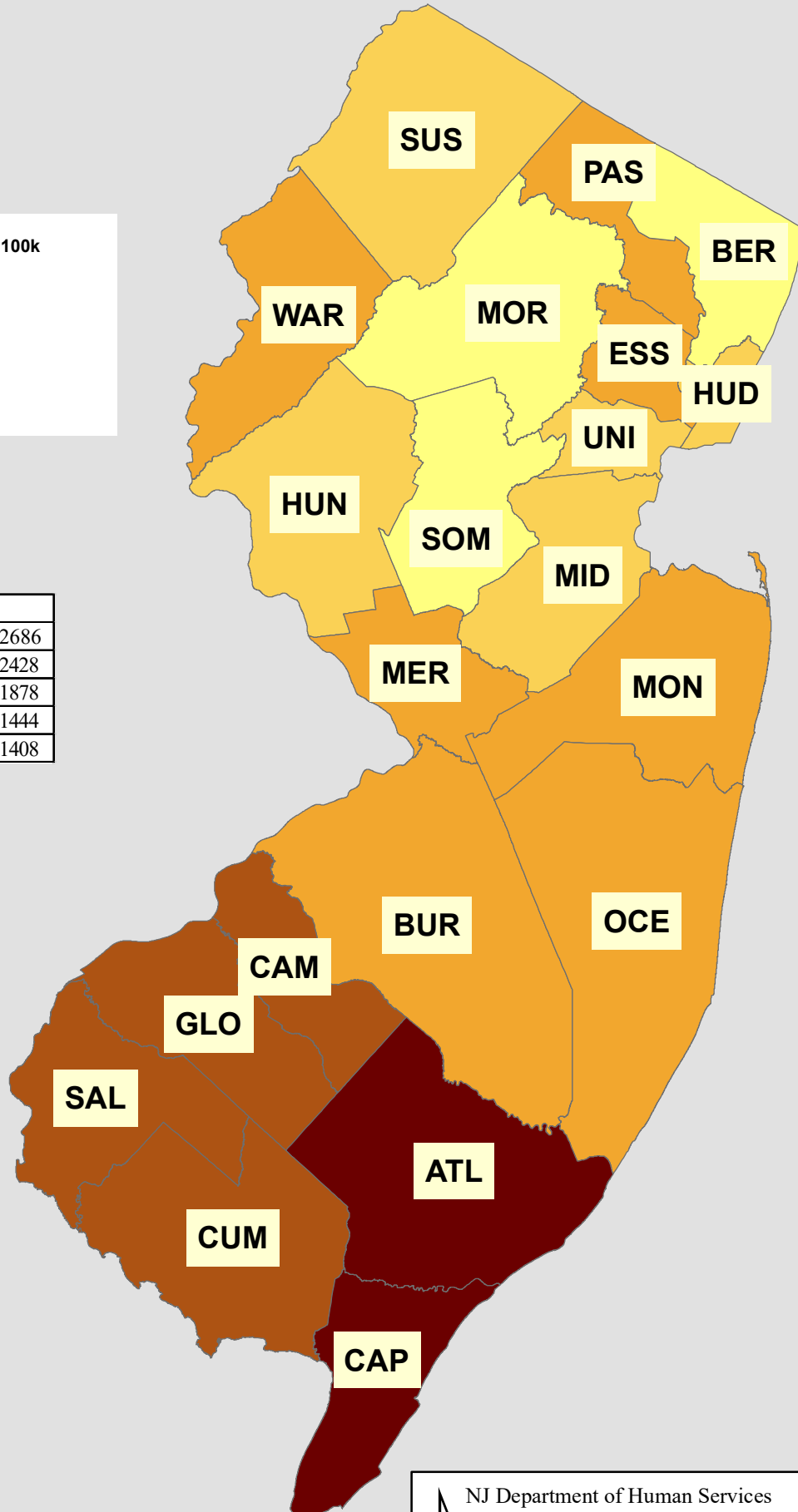
2022 NJ Substance Use Admissions Per 100k Residents by County
