Commodities in Package Form; Weights and Measures**

Take notice that pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1, the rules at N.J.A.C. 13:47K were scheduled to expire on May 1, 2021. The rules at N.J.A.C. 13:47K prescribe the requirements for labeling commodities in package form. In this context, commodities refers to both household items sold at retail establishments and items for industrial use or wholesale distribution. Subchapter 1 adopts by reference the 2018 edition of the Uniform Packaging and Labeling Regulation in the National Institute for Standards and Technology (NIST) Handbook 130, as amended and supplemented, and further stipulates that there are still State-specific rules for parties to adhere to, along with the NIST Handbook 130 standards. Subchapter 2 establishes compliance requirements regarding declaration of net quantity for packages subject to Federal regulations and the applicable units for net quantity for packages that are not subject to Federal regulation. Subchapter 3 is reserved. Subchapter 4 sets forth the labeling requirements for commodities in package form relating to: identifying the commodity; the quantity of the commodity; and the responsible manufacturer, packer, or distributor. Subchapter 5 sets forth the allowable variations to declared net weights and measures.

The Division of Consumer Affairs, Office of Weights and Measures, has reviewed these rules and has determined them to be necessary, reasonable, and proper for the purpose for which they were originally promulgated, as required by Executive Order No. 66 (1978). Therefore, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 51:1-29 and 51:1-61, and in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1.c(1), these rules are readopted without amendment and shall continue in effect for a seven-year period.

Take notice that the rules at N.J.A.C. 16:51 are scheduled to expire on April 16, 2021. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1.c(1), the Motor Vehicle Commission (Commission) readopts the provisions at N.J.A.C. 16:51 without changes to the existing rules.

The purpose of this chapter is to continue the Commission's practices and procedures before the Division of Inspection Services Bus Unit, including the process for obtaining certificates of public convenience and necessity (CPCN) to conduct autobus operations, to permit the Commission to effectively carry out its statutory functions, and to secure just and expeditious determinations of issues properly presented to it.

The chapter contains rules on the following topics: N.J.A.C. 16:51-1 pertains to general provisions, including scope, construction, definitions, communications, appearance, ethical conduct and ex parte communications, and former employees; N.J.A.C. 16:51-2 pertains to pleadings, including pleadings generally, formal requirements for pleadings, time for filing, amendments, service and notice of proceedings, and withdrawal of petition or dismissal of proceedings; N.J.A.C. 16:51-3 pertains to petitions; N.J.A.C. 16:51-4 pertains to motions and intervention; N.J.A.C. 16:51-5 pertains to rehearing or reconsideration; N.J.A.C. 16:51-6 pertains to conferences; N.J.A.C. 16:51-7 pertains to reporting accidents; N.J.A.C. 16:51-8 pertains to the provision of services; N.J.A.C. 16:51-9 pertains to offices; N.J.A.C. 16:51-10 pertains to records; N.J.A.C. 16:51-11 pertains to notices regarding changes in fares or operating schedules; and N.J.A.C. 16:51-12 pertains to compliance with orders and decisions.

The Commission has carefully considered these rules and has determined that it is necessary to maintain the rules as proposed for readoption to promote streamlined and efficient standards for inspection, CPCN, and the process of obtaining determinations.

Therefore, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1.c(1), the rules are readopted and shall continue in effect for a seven-year period.
