From the perspective of transportation access, it is important that greenways connect with places where people want to go, such as neighborhoods, schools, parks, business centers, shopping areas, and transit stops. Greenways also provide an excellent opportunity for embedded community and neighborhood parks.

#### Greenways

are corridors of protected open space managed for conservation and recreation purposes and often follow natural land or water features.

#### Trails

are paths used for walking, bicycling, horseback riding or other forms of recreation or transportation. Some greenways include trails, and some do not.

This framework of using a regional greenway with local connections to adjacent communities is an integral part of planning efforts of another New Jersey canal trail along the Delaware and Raritan Canal.

### **PROPOSED GREENWAYS/TRAILS**

The proposed greenway will extend across Warren County with the canal as a link to recreational, cultural, and historic areas including state parks and trails and public open space. The greenway will extend between Phillipsburg and Waterloo Village.

#### **Highlands Trail**

When completed, the Highlands Trail will extend over 150 miles from the Hudson River in New York to the Delaware River in Phillipsburg, connecting major scenic attractions. The proposed Warren County section of the Highlands route will head south from Jenny Jump Mountain to Merrill Creek Environmental Preserve, Scotts Mountain and then to the Delaware River in Phillipsburg.

#### Warren Trail

Tracts of donated abandoned rail line will be converted for recreational hiking purposes. The proposed Warren Trail, to begin north of Hackettstown, will converge with the final stretch of the Highlands Trail near the Pequest Fish and Wildlife Area and continue south to the Delaware River in Phillipsburg.

#### **Musconetcong River Trail**

designed for hiking, runs along the slope of Musconetcong Mountain and runs west above the Musconetcong River.

#### **Bread Lock Park**

Future Morris Canal Park site lies between New Village and Stewartsville on Route 57. The Warren County Historic Learning Center is also on this site. This is the only location where the Morris Canal crossed Route 57.

#### Saxton Falls

AMorris Canal towpath trail travels north of Hacketts town between Saxton Falls and Waterloo Village. This site is also an intersection for the proposed routes of the Highlands and Warren trails.



A Morris Canal towpath overlooks Saxon Falls at former Guard Lock 5 West. This is a popular site for fly fishing.

#### Merrill Creek Reservoir Environmental Preserve

The proposed Warren and Highlands trails will run through Merrill Creek Preserve area. The Morris Canal Committee hopes to create an additional connector trail linking the Morris Canal to the Preserve.

#### Phillipsburg

Phillipsburg was once served by five railroads and is the western terminus of the Morris Canal. A linked system of trails from converted rail lines along the river is a possibility.

#### FUNDING RESOURCES

Funding for greenways and trails can be obtained through a variety of transportation, open space, and parks programs, as well as through brownfield, community development and arts programs. Communities across the country have also raised private funds for development and maintenance of their greenways through various fundraising campaigns.
